<p>Outpatient GP Visit - Fullerton Health @ NTU Clinic</p>	<p>Mode of Identification:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students need to present Matriculation Card together with Identification Card/ SingPass e-Identification Card <div style="display: flex; justify-content: space-around; align-items: center;">   </div> <p>Consultation Fees</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Subsidized consultation fees at the Fullerton Health @ NTU at S\$3 per visit (inclusive of GST) up to 10 visits per academic year S\$3 fee is waived from the 11th visit onwards in the same academic year General exclusions apply <p>Medications</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Standard medications (zero costs) Eg. Paracetamol, Chlorpheniramine, Amoxicillin, Erythromycin, Metoclopramide and Activated Charcoal tablets Non-standard drugs and treatments will be charged at cost For medications dispensed, there is no refund or return of medications
<p>Outpatient GP Visit - Singapore Government Polyclinics</p>	<p>Reimbursement is applicable only for</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Singapore Govt Polyclinics Subsidised rate for consultation and treatment, up to cap of individual reimbursable limit. Non exclusion condition.
<p>Accident & Emergency Visit</p>	<p>Reimbursement is only available for</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> A&E visits to Government Restructured Hospitals and is capped at S\$50 per visit. A&E visits to Private Hospitals are not eligible for reimbursement.

<p>Outpatient Specialist Visit</p>	<p>Reimbursement is applicable only for</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Referrals from Fullerton Health @ NTU or Government Polyclinics (for local undergraduate or postgraduate students) and for referrals to specialist outpatient clinics at Government hospitals. • Reimbursement for consultation and treatment at a subsidized rate, with a cap on individual reimbursable items • Consultations with outpatient specialists at private hospitals are not eligible for reimbursement. <p>International students may refer to AIA Group Specialist Outpatient Insurance</p>
<p>Hospitalisation & Surgical</p>	<p>Inpatient Admission</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Referral by Fullerton Health is required for NTU Student Group Hospitalisation & Surgical insurance claims • Reimbursement is applicable only to subsidized Class B2 and C Wards at all Government Restructured Hospitals. • Class A and B1 Wards are non-reimbursable. • General exclusions apply. <p>International students may refer to AIA Group Hospitalisation & Surgical Insurance</p> <p>Reimbursable items (subject to change):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Emergency Ambulance fee for emergency purpose from campus to the nearest Government Restructured Hospital; • Ward charges: S\$50 per day, for up to 21 days; • Daily treatment fee: S\$16 per day, for up to 21 days; • Surgery: up to S\$298 per admission; • X-ray: up to S\$50 per admission; • Laboratory service: up to S\$50 per admission; • Rehabilitative services: up to S\$50 per admission (Note: no reimbursement for consumables); • Implant: up to S\$100 for standard implant per admission; • Standard medications: up to S\$50 per admission; • A&E (with admission or no admission): up to S\$50 per visit;

<p>Pre-Existing Illnesses/ Conditions</p>	<p>If hospitalization is not due to pre-existing illnesses or conditions, and/ or is not cosmetic in nature, the expenses can be claimed only for class B2 & C; Class A & B1 admissions are not reimbursable)</p>
