MOE Subsidy

SCs and SPRs undergraduates pursuing part-time programmes who meet the following criteria are eligible for the MOE subsidy:

- Have not previously received a government subsidy/scholarship for a first degree; and
- Be at least 21 years of age;
- Have 2 years of full-time work experience or have fully discharged their full-time NS liability or are currently employed on a full-time basis¹

¹ In line with MOM's definition last revised on 1 Jan 2009, a full-time employee is one who works for more than 35 hours a week under contract of service with an employer.
