Connecting Research with Ethics

Have you collected any human tissues through your research work?


If you are planning to **transfer-out** or **supply** human tissues to your collaborators, PIs are to **obtain relevant approvals**:

For <u>individually-identifiable</u> tissues:

- Obtain approval from NTU-IRB.

For <u>non-identifiable</u> tissues:

- Obtain approval from NTU-Tissue Banking Board (NTU-TBB); or
- from your Tissue Access Committee (TAC).



Important notes

- Obtain documentary evidence from your collaborator that they
 will ensure that the intended use of the tissue is in accordance
 with any restrictions/conditions of the donors' appropriate consent.
- To export tissues out of Singapore, consent must be obtained from the tissue donor if the tissues are individually-identifiable. If de-identified tissues are exported, donors must not have stipulated that they do not wish to have their tissues
- To facilitate the export and supply of collected human tissues, a <u>Tissue Request Form</u> has been created, which will be reviewed by NTU-TBB in accordance with the Human Biomedical Research Act (HBRA). Please refer to our guide <u>here</u> for further details.
