Research Must Do No Harm:

New guidance addresses all studies relating to people

Nature recently wrote about the lack of guidance on the benefits/harms of academic research whose conclusions could affect **groups of people** who did not participate in such studies. Of concern are research which could lead to stigmatization, discrimination, homophobia etc... might be used to justify undermining the rights of **specifics groups** (because of their social characteristics) and thereby causing **'group harm'**.

"All academic research requires ethical consideration to maximize benefits and reduce or eliminate harms."

<u>Guidance</u> developed by Springer Nature editors aims to fill this gap. It encourages researchers, reviewers, and editors to respect the dignity & rights of groups of people; and calls for the research community to:

- * Consider potentially harmful implications of research as applied to groups;
- * Minimize the potential for misuse and the risks of harm to these groups; and
- * Use *respectful, non-stigmatizing language* in their manuscripts.



Collaborative Institutional Training Initiative (CITI) Certification

CITI certifications are required for all personnel in NTU conducting Human Subject Research – be it under the Social, Behavioural, Educational Research (SBER) or Human Biomedical Research (HBR) domains. They are valid for only 3 years. If you intend to continue conducting human subjects research – be it an existing IRB-approved research, or a new study – your CITI certification must be renewed <u>every 3 years</u> (upon expiration) by completing the *shorter* CITI <u>'Refresher' course</u>. If you are involved in the conduct of <u>human biomedical research</u> and/or <u>tissue banking</u> <u>activities</u> (as defined in the HBRA), it is mandatory for you to obtain certification by completing NTU's 'Human Biomedical Research Act (HBRA) Programme'.
