

Connecting Research with Ethics

CONTINUING REVIEWS AND PROJECT CLOSURES



Pls are required to submit their Continuing Reviews (CRs) **annually** to report on the progress of their studies. Pls who fail to submit their CRs may have their study **suspended**.

Over-recruitment

Participants who have signed an informed consent form are considered **recruited** into a study, even if they subsequently decide to **withdraw** or **drop-out** before completing the full study procedures. Such withdrawals and drop-outs are to be included in the total number of subjects enrolled.

If the number of subjects recruited exceeds the approved maximum recruitment number, it is considered a **Protocol Deviation**.

Required Action:

Pls are required to submit an <u>amendment</u> to increase the maximum recruitment number before further recruitment.

Expiring Studies


Continuing a research study past its expiry date is considered a **Protocol Deviation**. Studies that have expired must cease all study procedures immediately.

Required Action:

- 1. Submit an amendment to extend the approval period; or
- 2. Submit a Project Closure (PC) report BEFORE the study expires.
