Activation of the Human Tissue Framework

In preparation for the activation of the Human Tissue Framework (HTF) under the <u>Human Biomedical Research Act (HBRA)</u>, RIEO conducted 2 roadshows in Jan and Oct 2019 to prepare the local research community. Singapore's Ministry of Health has recently announced that HTF will come into full force on <u>1 Nov 2019</u>.

As shared during the roadshows, all NTU PIs conducting <u>tissue banking</u> <u>activities</u> are to ensure compliance with this new regulation. This includes the following:

- 1) Ensure that "Appropriate Consent" is obtained from your tissue donor.
- 2) Requirements for supply/ transfer-out of human tissues are met.
- 3) For tissues collected prior to 1 Nov 2019, ensure that they meet the minimum 3 core consent elements for continued usage.
- 4) Reporting of any safety issues or incidents to NTU-IRB.

Note: Human tissue removed from the donor's body and rendered non-identifiable prior to 1
Nov 2019 is exempted from the scope of HTF.



To comply with national regulations, PIs **must** <u>register</u> your tissue collections with RIEO for reporting to MOH.

Researchers contravening any part of this legislation may be guilty of an offence and liable to penalties including fines / imprisonment or both.

Updating of Used Animal Records on ARFMS

With the launch of the Animal Research Facility Management System (ARFMS) in Aug 2018, all animal records are to be updated on the system by **31** Dec 2019 to facilitate annual regulatory reporting to Animal & Veterinary Services (AVS).

Regulatory reporting of animal numbers to AVS is a requirement outlined in the NACLAR Guidelines. Researchers must adhere to this deadline to ensure accurate reporting of animal records by NTU.
