Retraction by Nobel Prize Winner

Caltech Professor Frances Arnold, who won the 2018 Nobel Prize in Chemistry for her work on directed evolution of enzymes, had her recent publication on enzymatic synthesis retracted from Science because the results were not reproducible. Prof Arnold twittered this <u>retraction</u> on 2 Jan and apologised after examination of the first author's lab notebooks revealed missing data. She has won praise from the Editor of Science and from her colleagues for her honesty in admitting mistakes and for her proactive approach. [+Read more]

Incident Reporting for IRB Approved Studies

After a study involving human subjects has been approved by NTU-IRB, any incident arising from the conduct of the study must be reported to NTU-IRB. **Incidents** could include protocol/ recruitment deviation, unanticipated problem, adverse events arising from a human subject participating in the research. These need to be reported **immediately** by PIs or study team members using the **Incident Report Form**. Unreported incidents may have serious consequences, including liabilities on the PI and study team members. [+Read more]

For studies under the scope of the Human Biomedical Research Act (HBRA), note that there are additional responsibilities and reporting requirements for PIs and study team members. [+Read more]
