



Managing Authorship Disputes

Ever felt unhappy and upset over the authorship sequence in your manuscript? Disagreements in authorship assignment can be an emotional experience for some researchers, leading to fallouts with supervisors or collaborative partners.



As **authorship disputes do occur in NTU**, we advise researchers to discuss and agree on authorship issues during the early stages of planning a project. Constant communication remains key to avoiding and managing authorship disputes.



RDM e-Learning Course on Workday

With the implementation of the NTU Data Governance Policy and NTU Research Data Policy, there has been greater focus and emphasis on the proper management of research data (especially sensitive data). NTU Library has created the Research Data Management (RDM) e-learning course and it is now available via Workday.
