

HL4014 Advanced Studies in Film introduces students to modern Asian cinema. Reading films from countries such as China, the Philippines, India, and Japan, students will be exposed to various cinematic histories and traditions, and cultures; they will also explore themes such as social inequality, gender, sexuality, and cultural identity. In addition, students will gain an in-depth understanding of the film medium and learn to analyze film as art, cultural products, and political interventions. More broadly, this module aims to equip students with the skills to negotiate and critically engage with visual culture.
