HL2009 is a general introduction to contemporary Southeast Asian literary works, films, and visual art. Each work will be studied in its historical context, allowing students to develop a broad understanding of Southeast Asian history and to trace transnational aesthetic developments; as well as in its particularity, as an autonomous work of art. This will allow students to develop an appreciation for the sheer diversity in Southeast Asian artistic output. Some thematic concerns discussed include cultural memory, class inequality, nationalism, religion, gender, and sexuality.
