Singapura, which means "Lion City" in Sanskrit, is a misnomer. Lions are not native to the region, so Sang Nila Utama, if he was indeed the one who named the city after the magnificent beast, probably made a mistake when he thought he sighted one here. Or perhaps we were simply "Singgah," a Malay word which could mean "sojourn," as in "Would you like to stay and have a rest for a while?" and "stopping by," "I'll stop by there before I leave." Somewhere along the way, we lost a "g" and an "h," acquired a "pura," then a "pore." If this has all along been Singgah, if this is indeed a stopover, where do we go from here? How did this become an extended stay for some? How does a temporary place become a permanent home? When are we ever home? These are the questions we will explore through the texts in this course. Surveying literature of Singapore written in English between 1950 and the present, we will consider the meaning of nostalgia, of home and homelessness, of belonging and foreignness, and the individual's place, both real and imagined, in an increasingly diverse world.
