Young and research-intensive, Nanyang Technological University (NTU Singapore) is ranked 15th globally (QS World Ranking 2024). NTU was ranked the world's best young university for the second year running in the Times Higher Education (THE) Young University Rankings 2024.

The School of Humanities at NTU is a dynamic, creative, and diverse community of scholars with research expertise in Art History, Chinese, English, History, Linguistics and Multilingual Studies, and Philosophy. The School also encourages interdisciplinary research in the following areas: Environmental Humanities, Food Studies, Gender and Diversity Studies, Medical Humanities, Religion, Society and Trust, Singapore Studies, South Asia Studies, and Southeast Asian Studies.

Postgraduate candidates will work closely with their supervisors. Our faculty members come from a wide range of research interests and specialties. Candidates will work towards a thesis on an approved topic and also take courses.

Graduates from the programmes will gain a solid background in research and applications. They will be fully equipped to have a career in research and teaching in world-class universities.

Admissions

For those seeking to matriculate for Semester 1 (August) intake, the deadline for application is 15 December. For those seeking to matriculate for Semester 2 (January) intake, the deadline is 31July.

The research programme can be pursued on a full-time or part-time basis. Full-time candidates with good results may be offered research scholarships.

ART HISTORY

The postgraduate programme in Art History welcomes applicants with broad interests art history, theory and critical practices. We have particular strengths in modern and contemporary Asian contexts, contemporary exhibition histories, experimental new media practices, and transmedial approaches to the study of art histories and visual cultures. Other areas of interest include: art and architecture in contemporary Asia, art and technology, and connective and comparative art histories across the Global South.



CHINESE

The Chinese graduate programme welcomes applications to pursue research in Chinese literature, language, history, Overseas Chinese and their languages, culture and history, and Singaporean-Malaysian Literature and Cultural Studies.

The English graduate programme welcomes applications to pursue research in any area or period of literary study, especially those which speak to its strengths in Contemporary Literature, Modern Literature, Southeast Asian Literature, Literature & Medicine, Early-Modern Literature, and Irish Studies. Creative Writing projects, especially in fiction and non-fiction, are also welcome.



HISTORY

The graduate programme in History welcomes applications for MA and PhD degrees specializing in all regions and time periods. The programme has particular strengths in the histories of medicine, science and technology, as well as the histories of ancient, modern, and contemporary South and Southeast Asia. We also encourage projects that address any aspect of colonialism and decolonisation, religion, gender and sexuality, and environmental, heritage and applied history.

OUR PROGRAMMES



LINGUISTICS AND MULTILINGUAL STUDIES

The graduate programme in Linguistics and Multilingual Studies is dedicated to producing postgraduates in linguistics who will be able to demonstrate expertise in one or more areas within the field. Candidates for the LMS programme can pursue research in the any of the key research areas: Language and Cognition, Documenting Endangered Languages and Culture, Investigating Conversational Interaction, Shifting Identities in Local and Global Interaction, and Computational Linguistics.



PHILOSOPHY

The graduate programme in Philosophy invites applicants from a wide range of approaches and traditions in philosophy. The programme has particular strengths in Chinese Philosophy, Philosophy of Science, and Ethics and Political Philosophy. Research may be pursued within a particular tradition such as Chinese Philosophy or Anglo-American Philosophy, or from a comparative or interdisciplinary perspective.



INTERDISCIPLINARY RESEARCH

SoH promotes interdisciplinary research, which is an exciting new area that involves collaborations between disciplines within the school. Our strategic interdisciplinary research clusters include areas such as Environmental Humanities, Medical Humanities, and more. Applicants are encouraged to apply to one of the six core disciplines best suited to their area of research.
