Course Aims

This course will provide a survey of the domestic politics of Southeast Asia. Nations studied will include Cambodia, Indonesia, Laos, Malaysia, Myanmar, Philippines, Thailand, Vietnam, and Singapore. It will also examine the important factors that shape the political landscape of Southeast Asia, both historical and contemporary. We will approach this module via both thematic and case-study approaches. It would not be possible to cover every single Southeast Asian country in great depth in just one module; nevertheless, we will be discussing the major issues associated with the most important nations in the region.

- 1) Explain the basic contours of modern Southeast Asian politics.
- 2) Identify the contemporary debates on Southeast Asian politics and public policy issues.
- 3) Describe the historical forces which shape Southeast Asian politics today.
