## **Course Aims**

This course is designed for students who aim to achieve an upper-intermediate to lower-advanced level of proficiency. The course focuses on building students' communication skills and vocabulary in a variety of authentic situation, including social, historical, and cultural contexts. This course aims to equip students with advanced skills and strategies to communicate effectively in diverse situation and achieve a high-level proficiency in Korean. It enables students to understand and produce complex text in a variety of genres, including academic and professional contexts. By the end of the course, students should be able to develop critical thinking and engage in critical discussion in relation to Korean language and culture. This course provides extensive practice in the skills required for TOPIK (Test Of Proficiency In Korean), a standardized Korean language test.

- 1. **Communicate** confidently and effectively in diverse Korean contexts, using advanced language skills and cultural awareness.
- 2. **Comprehend** complex Korean texts and engage in critical discussions and debates on various topics of interest.
- 3. **Produce** sophisticated written texts in Korean, demonstrating advanced grammatical and rhetorical skills and cultural awareness.
- 4. **Demonstrate** a deep understanding and appreciation of Korean culture, history, and customs, and critically reflect on contemporary societal issues and traditional Korean values using Korean language as a medium of expression and analysis.

## **Description of Assessment Components**

- **(CA 1) Written Test**: The test will include a variety of tasks such as multiple-choice questions, short answer questions, and essay writing to evaluate student's knowledge and understanding of vocabulary, grammar and reading comprehension skills.
- **(CA 2) Listening Test**: The test is to evaluate student's ability to understand spoken Korean both conversation and narrative in various contexts.
- **(CA 3) Oral I**: This is designed to assess the student's ability to communicate effectively in spoken language. During the interview, a student will be asked a series of question related to the course material, as well as personal experiences or opinions. The student will receive feedback and comments on the spot after the interview.

- **(CA 4) Oral II**: An oral presentation to evaluate a student's ability to deliver a prepared speech or presentation in front of an audience. Individual oral feedback on the fluency, pronunciation, contents, structure, and communication skills will be given to each student.
- **(CA 5) Writing portfolio:** A writing portfolio is a compilation of written works that a student has produced over the course of the semester. Each student will receive Individualized written feedback and comments regarding their proficiency in written communication, ability to organize and structure ideas, and effective use of language.
- **(CA 6) Video Quizzes**: Quizzes comprising vocabulary and expressions are given before the start of each chapter, and corrections are given along with the score.
- **(CA 7) Homework and Participation**: This is to evaluate the participation of students in short in-class learning oral/writing activities, such as summarising group discussions; taking notes; giving an oral report; and completing homework assignments.

### Formative feedback

Formative assessment is integrated into the classroom practice to provide feedback on the learning progress to both students and teachers. All assessments in the course must be formative. The feedback will be given in a prompt and informative manner with specific reference to the Intended Learning Outcomes as soon as possible during or after the learning activity.
