Background

BG(retd) Dr Lionel K. H. Lee, PPA, MBBS, MSS (Spts Medicine), MPH, FAMS

After graduating in Medicine in 1975, Prof Lionel Lee joined the Singapore Armed Forces (SAF) Medical Corps in 1976 and rose to the rank of Brigadier General and the Chief of the Medical Corps. From 1997 to 2011, he was the Director of Defence Medical and Environmental Research Institute (DMERI) of DSO National Laboratories. Later, he was the Executive Vice-Dean of the Lee Kong Chian School of Medicine (LKCMedicine), Singapore's newest medical school. His responsibility is to establish a first-class organisation and provide state of the art facilities for the School. He retired in 2019 and in January 2024 Lionel was conferred in inaugural Professor Emeritus of the Lee Kong Chian School of Medicine, Nanyang Technological University, Singapore

He earned a Master's degree in Sports Medicine graduating as an outstanding honours student in 1983 at the United States Sports Academy. In 1992, he obtained a Master's in Public Health at the Uniformed Services University for Health Sciences at Bethesda, Maryland, graduating as a valedictorian. He was inducted as a Fellow of the Academy of Medicine, Singapore in May 1997.

Lionel set up the Soldier Performance Centre for the Singapore Army and the Defence Medical and Environmental Research Institute, DSO, Ministry of Defence, Singapore. During his tenure as Chief of the Medical Corps he placed the Corps on an operational footing with several medical teams being despatched for humanitarian, peace support and peace keeping operations in many countries around the world. He founded the practice of Sports and Rehabilitation Medicine and Exercise Physiology in the Singapore Armed

Forces. He established formal Paramedic Training in Singapore which helped initiate the Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) vocation in Singapore Civil Defence.

He was credited for the prevention and emergency treatment of heat injuries in the Singapore Army reducing significantly the number of heat exhaustion and death from heat strokes during training. In Exercise Physiology, he helped establish the fitness standards and tests of the SAF. From 2006-2010 he served on the MOH's Sub-speciality Training Committee Sports Medicine, Specialist Accreditation Board, which established Sports Medicine as a recognised sub-speciality in Singapore in 2011.

As Director, DMERI at DSO National Laboratories, Lionel guided and developed MINDEF's research programmes in Biodefence and Emerging Infections, Chemical, Radiological and Nuclear Defence, Military Trauma and Combat Casualty Care, Military Physiology and Cognitive Performance. From Aug 2001 to Jul 2007, he was an adjunct Associate Professor to the Faculty of Medicine, National University of Singapore. From Dec 2009 to June 2012, he was adjunct Professor, Office of Research, Duke-NUS Graduate Medical School where he assisted in establishing its Emerging Infections Research Programme.

As Executive Vice-Dean Lionel, guided the Lee Kong Chian School of Medicine through its developmental phases. He was responsible for the organisation, operations and administrative excellence as well as the external and international relations of the school. He oversaw the development of the buildings, research facilities and other infrastructures of LKCMedicine. Together with Imperial College London, he helped established the medical education curriculum and pedagogy and its flagship research programmes. He assisted in developing the School's PhD programme and administered its first courses.

He served as Director on several health care, research advisory committees and boards of management. Notably he was one of the founding members on the Board of Directors for the Singapore Eye Research Institute (SERI) and served on the board for 15 years until 2014. He was a founding member of the National Healthcare Group's (NHG) Governing Board. He was on the Boards of the National University Hospital and the Singapore General Hospital.

He was a pioneer member of the Dover Park Hospice Governing Council and served for 22 years, eight of which as its chairman. In August 2023, he was appointed Honorary Life Member of the Governing Council.

Lionel is the Chairman of two mission schools in Thailand, the Vineyard Methodist School in Chiangmai and the Little Candles Methodist School in Phrau. He is also the founding and current Chairman of the Methodist Welfare Society-Charis Methodist Church Activity Centre for Elders,

He is a recipient of several professional, national and military awards and medals.
