1. Scholarships

Scholarships

At LKCMedicine, we offer exclusive scholarship awards for our incoming MBBS students to recognise their academic excellence and leadership potential. Our scholarships are specially designed to fulfill the needs of our students.

Application

To qualify for scholarships, candidates should apply for scholarships online which is found at the end of their online application for admissions.

Selection

Candidates' application and performance at the Multiple Mini Interviews (MMI) for the admissions will be taken into consideration for the award of scholarship. There is no additional interview for scholarship.

Candidates who are selected for the scholarships will be requested to accept the scholarship and admissions offer at the same time.

The merit-based scholarships are awarded to candidates with exemplary academic performance, leadership qualities and conduct.

1. LKCMedicine Scholarship

The LKCMedicine Scholarship is offered to outstanding students aiming to pursue their undergraduate MBBS programme in NTU. It is tenable for 5 years, subject to consistently good academic performance and satisfactory conduct.

Eligibility

- Singapore Citizens
- Outstanding results in GCE 'A' Levels, Local Polytechnic Diploma, NUS High School Diploma or International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma
- Outstanding contributions or attributes in other areas such as community service, student leadership, or sporting excellence

Award Benefits

- Subsidised Tuition Fees (after Tuition Grant)
- Living Allowance of \$6,000 per Academic Year (AY)
- Book Allowance of \$500 per AY
- One-off Computer Allowance of \$1,500

Merit-Based Scholarships

2. Ong Hok Tien Scholarship

The Ong Hok Tien Scholarship is offered to outstanding students aiming to pursue their undergraduate MBBS programme in NTU. It is tenable for 5 years, subject to consistently good academic performance and satisfactory conduct.

Eligibility

- Singapore Citizens and Singapore Permanent Residents
- Outstanding results in GCE 'A' Levels, Local Polytechnic Diploma, NUS High School Diploma, International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma or Year 12 equivalent qualifications
- Excellent CCA records and strong leadership qualities/potential

Award Benefits

- Subsidised Tuition Fees (after Tuition Grant)
- Living Allowance of \$6,000 per Academic Year (AY)
- Book Allowance of \$500 per AY
- One-off Computer Allowance of \$1,500

Merit-Based Scholarships

3. ASEAN Undergraduate Scholarship

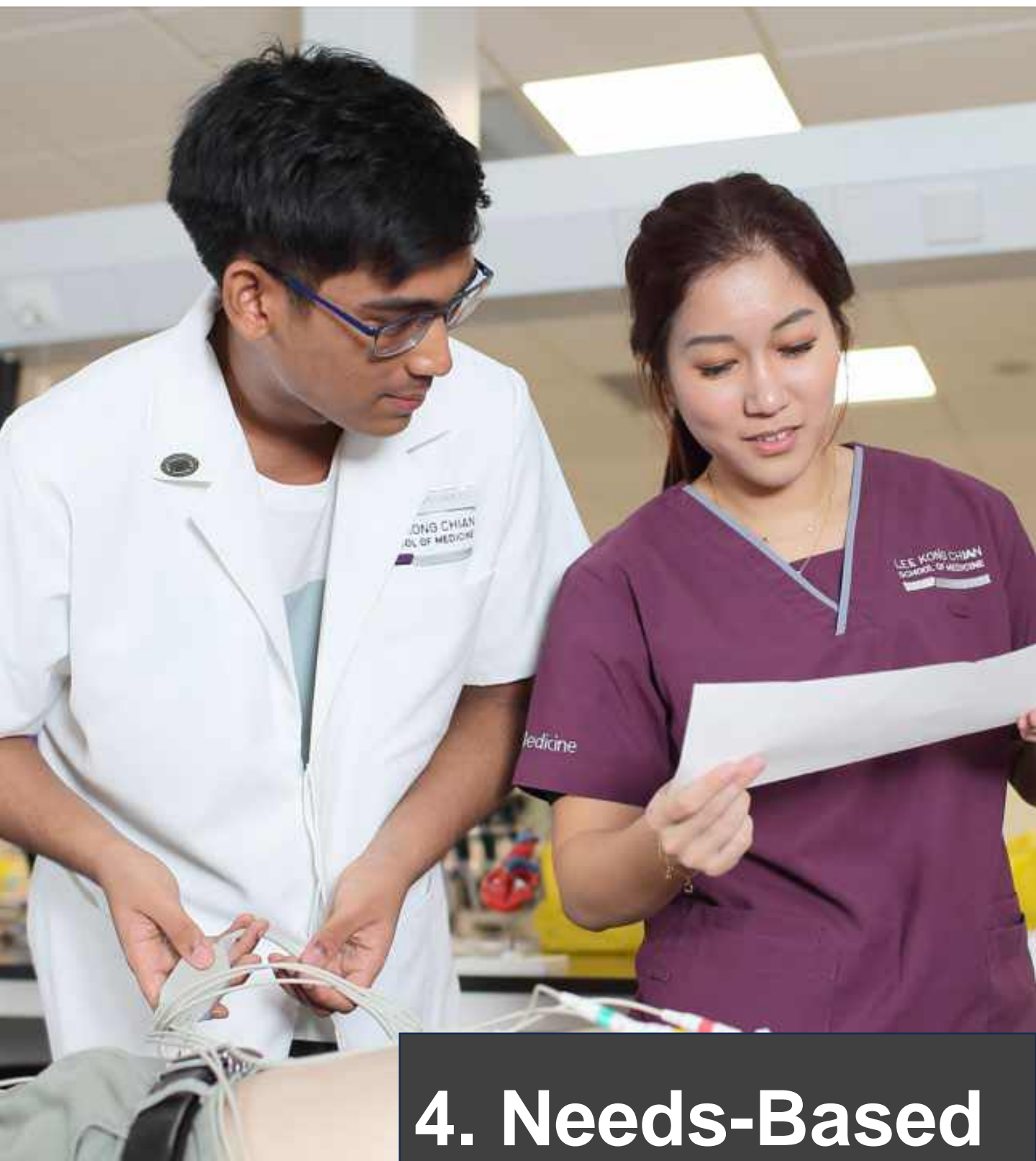
The ASEAN Undergraduate Scholarship is offered by NTU for citizens or permanent residents from the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) countries, except Singapore.

Eligibility

- Singapore Permanent Residents or Citizens from ASEAN countries (except Singapore)
- Outstanding results in GCE 'A' Levels, Local Polytechnic Diploma, NUS High School Diploma, International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma or Year 12 equivalent qualifications
- Excellent CCA records and strong leadership qualities/potential

Award Benefits

- Subsidised Tuition Fees (after Tuition Grant)
- Living Allowance of \$5,800 per Academic Year
- Accommodation allowance of \$3,000 per academic year
- One off computer allowance of \$1,750



4. Needs-Based Scholarships

Needs-Based Scholarships

In addition to academic excellence, qualities and conduct, preference for needs-based scholarship will be given to applicants who demonstrate financial need.

Applicants who meet the following income criteria will be considered for the needs-based scholarships:

**Per Capita Income
(PCI)***

Less than or equal to
\$2,500
per month

OR

**Gross Household
Income (GHI)**

Less than or equal to
\$10,000
per month

**The PCI is calculated as follows:*

$$PCI = \frac{\text{Gross Household Income (GHI)}}{\text{Total No. of Family Members in Household}}$$

**GHI refers to income before CPF deductions. It includes income, allowances, overtime, commissions and other sources of income by family members residing in the same household as the applicant.*

Applicants who are considered for these scholarships would be required to submit their family income documents to LKCMedicine for verification. Applicants who meet the income criteria will be offered the needs-based scholarship.

Needs-Based Scholarships

1. Toh Kian Chui Scholarship

The Toh Kian Chui Scholarship is tenable for 5 years, subject to consistently good academic performance and satisfactory conduct.

Eligibility

- Singapore Citizens
- Outstanding results in GCE 'A' Levels, Local Polytechnic Diploma, NUS High School Diploma or International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma
- Outstanding contributions or attributes in other areas such as community service, student leadership, or sporting excellence
- Preference will be given to students from lower income families

Award Benefits

- Subsidised Tuition Fees (after Tuition Grant)
- Living Allowance of \$6,000 per Academic Year (AY)
- Book Allowance of \$500 per AY

Needs-Based Scholarships

2. Ng Ghit Cheong Foundation Scholarship

The Ng Ghit Cheong Foundation Scholarship is tenable for 5 years, subject to consistently good academic performance and satisfactory conduct.

Eligibility

- Singapore citizens or Singapore Permanent Residents
- Outstanding results in GCE 'A' Levels, Local Polytechnic Diploma, NUS High School Diploma or International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma
- Outstanding contributions or attributes in other areas such as community service, student leadership, or sporting excellence
- Preference will be given to students from lower income families

Award Benefits

- Subsidised Tuition Fees (after Tuition Grant)

Needs-Based Scholarships

3. Irene Tan Liang Kheng Scholarship

The Irene Tan Liang Kheng Scholarship is offered to provide opportunities to deserving Singaporean students. The award is tenable for 5 years, subject to the recipient maintaining consistently good academic performance and satisfactory conduct.

Eligibility

- Singapore Citizens
- Outstanding results in GCE 'A' Levels, Local Polytechnic Diploma, NUS High School Diploma, International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma
- Strong academic achievement, demonstrate desire to serve the community, possess compassion, and commitment to pursuing medical studies and medicine
- Preference will be given to students from lower income families

Award Benefits

- Covers up to \$30,000 for each Academic Year

Needs-Based Scholarships

4. Sim Yung Chong Medical Scholarship

The Sim Yung Chong Medical Scholarship is tenable for 5 years, subject to consistently good academic performance and satisfactory conduct.

Eligibility

- Singapore citizens or Singapore Permanent Residents
- Outstanding results in GCE 'A' Levels, Local Polytechnic Diploma, NUS High School Diploma, International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma
- Outstanding contributions or attributes in other areas such as community service, student leadership
- Preference will be given to students who demonstrate financial need and are able to speak Mandarin

Award Benefits

- Covers up to \$15,000 for each Academic Year

Needs-Based Scholarships

5. Temasek Foundation – G Muthukumarasamy Scholarship

The Temasek Foundation Scholarships honour the legacy of three outstanding union leaders who tirelessly championed for the welfare of lower-income workers and advocated for access to certified training and skills upgrading. The Scholarships support students (and their families) from lower income backgrounds by providing annual living expenses and a family incentive component for the duration of study.

Eligibility

- Singapore Citizens with Per Capita Income \leq \$1,875
- Excellent Singapore-Cambridge GCE 'A' level, Diploma awarded by a polytechnic in Singapore, NUS High School Diploma, IB Diploma or Year 12 equivalent qualifications.
- Outstanding contributions or attributes in other areas such as community service, student leadership

Award Benefits

- Living allowance of \$7,500 annually.
- Family recognition award of \$2,000 annually (the awardee can nominate an individual to receive the award).



5. Other Scholarships

Scholarship for Existing Students

LKCMedicine-NTU Talent Scholarship

The scholarship is awarded to LKCMedicine undergraduates with outstanding talent achievements, including artistic, sporting and leadership/interpersonal talents representing NTU or Singapore or having made a significant societal impact within and outside NTU.

This will be open to LKCMedicine students in Year 3 to 5 from AY2025-26 onwards.

Eligibility

- Open to all nationalities
- Excellent talent achievements and passion to contribute to NTU's campus life and/or strategic sectors.
- Outstanding leadership qualities and potential.

Award Benefits

- Full coverage of subsidised tuition fees (after Tuition Grant).
- Living allowance of S\$6,500 per academic year.
- Accommodation allowance of up to S\$2,000 per academic year. (Applicable to scholarship holders who reside in NTU hostels only.)
- Talent grant of up to S\$5,000 subject to approval..

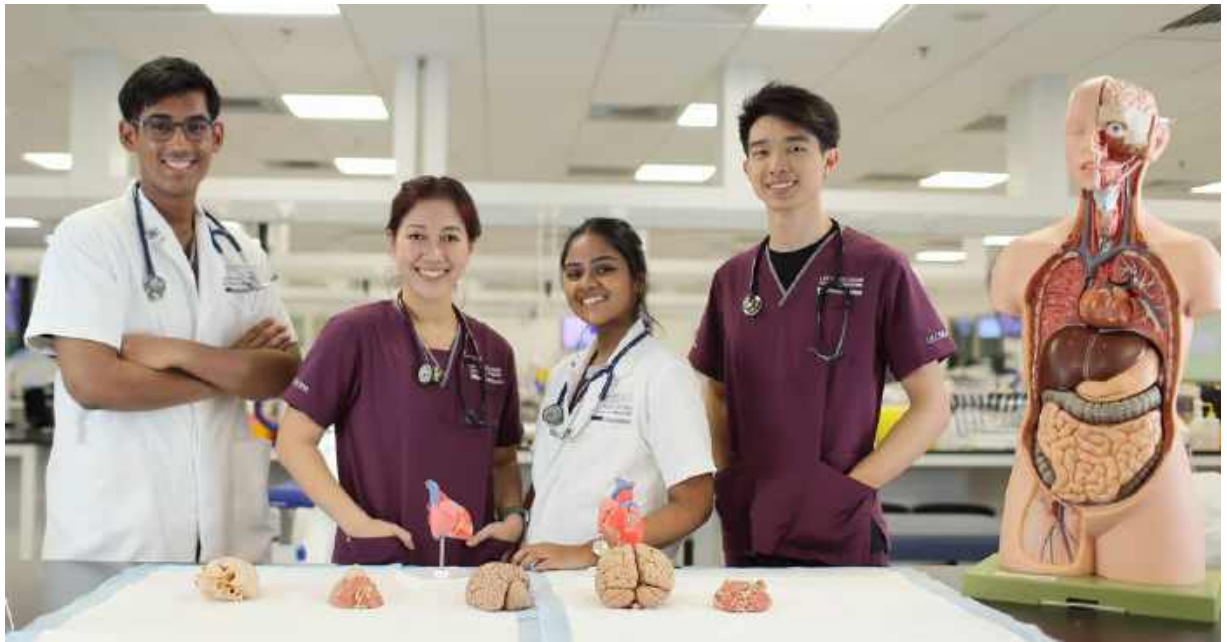

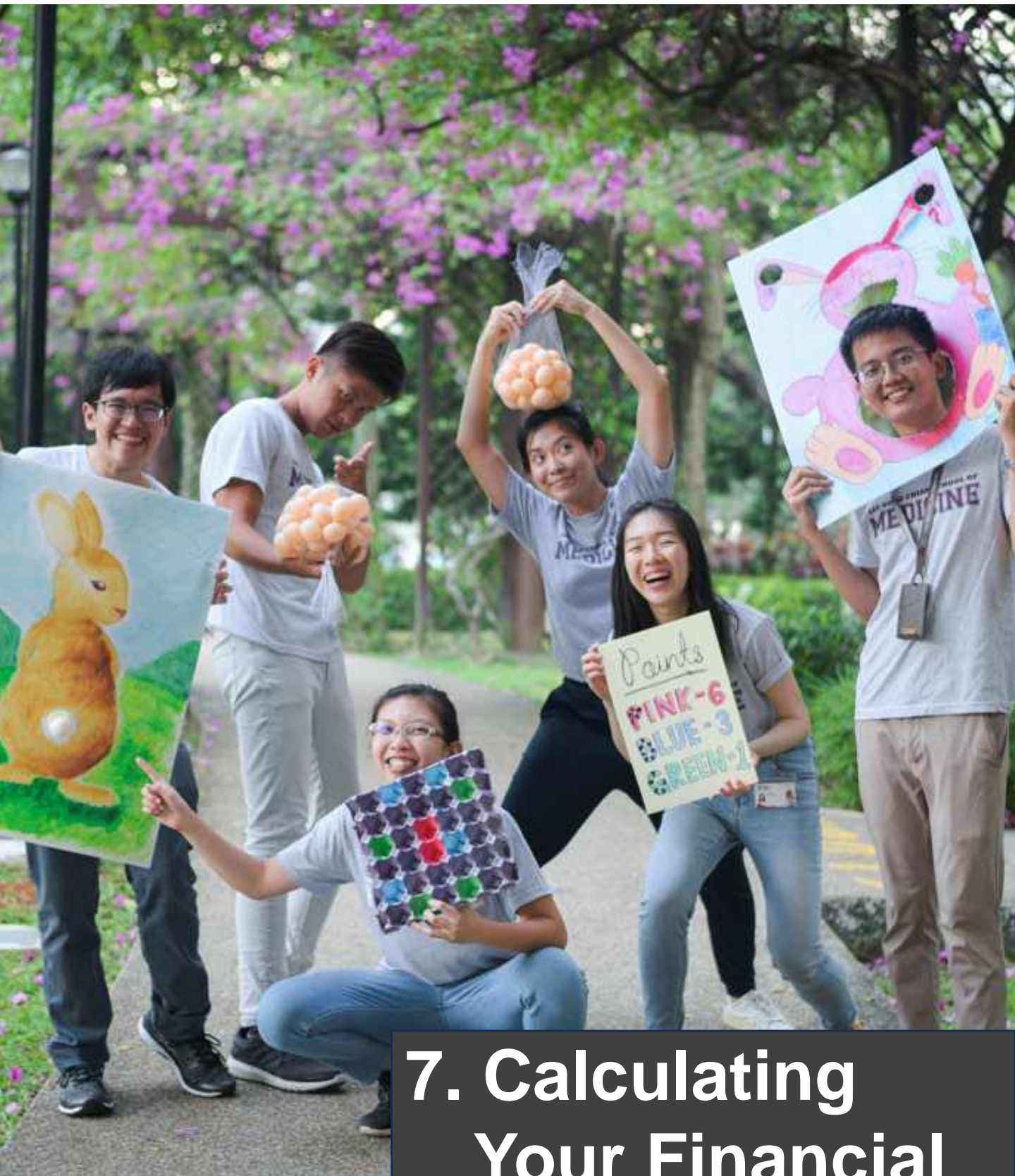

10. Bursaries for Living Allowance and Tuition Fees for LKC Medicine Students

Bursaries for Singaporean Students

(Living allowance and tuition fees)

Bursaries are available for financially-needy students pursuing their MBBS programme at NTU. These bursaries support student's living allowance and tuition fees. To be eligible, students should meet either of the following criteria:

**Per Capita
Income (PCI)***

Less than or
equal to \$2,500
per month

OR

**Gross
Household
Income (GHI)**

Less than or
equal to \$10,000
per month

**The PCI is calculated as follows:*

$$PCI = \frac{\text{Gross Household Income (GHI)}}{\text{Total No. of Family Members in Household}}$$

**GHI refers to income before CPF deductions. It includes income, allowances, overtime, commissions and other sources of income by family members residing in the same household as the applicant.*

The bursary award will be used to offset any outstanding fees.

Any balance will be credited to the student's registered GIRO account.

You cannot concurrently hold any other scholarship/bursary/award, without the approval of the awarding authority.

Only one bursary application is required to be submitted for each Academic Year. Students will be required to submit a fresh application every Academic Year.

Bursaries for Singapore Permanent Residents and International Students

Singapore Permanent Resident (SPR) and International students (IS) who meet the income eligibility will receive school bursary awards amounting to a percentage of the tuition fees paid by a Singaporean student.

The amount awarded will be based on the bursary tier as below:

\$1,876 to \$2,500		\$7,501 to \$10,000	20% of Singaporean Tuition Fees

Notes:

The bursary award will be used to offset any outstanding fees.

Any balance will be credited to the student's registered GIRO account.

You cannot concurrently hold any other scholarship/bursary/award, without the approval of the awarding authority.

Only one bursary application is required to be submitted for each Academic Year. Students will be required to submit a fresh application every Academic Year.

How to Apply for Bursaries (for living allowance and tuition fees)

Students who meet the income eligibility would normally receive bursary awards. Please refer to tables indicated on Page 31 (for Singaporeans) and Page 32 (for SPRs and IS) for the estimated bursary amounts that one would be eligible for, based on bursary tiers. Therefore, eligible students are strongly encouraged to apply.

- 1st window: 1 Feb - 31 Mar
- 2nd window: 1 Jul – 15 Aug



Outcome of Application

You will be informed of the outcome via your NTU email account at either of the following period:

- 1st application window (Feb – Mar): Around Jun – Jul
- 2nd application window (Jul – Aug): Around Sep – Oct

Successful applicants are required to accept the offer online before the funds can be disbursed.

Note for SMA Medical Students' Assistance Fund:

Students who are receiving bursaries from the School are eligible for the SMA Medical Students' Assistance Fund, subjected to School's approval.
