Wither language teaching? Rebalancing what matters in ELT in the age of AI

Assoc/P Csilla Weninger was a featured speaker at the 58th RELC conference. Her talk discussed the impact of artificial intelligence tools on language teaching and learning. She discussed three enduring notions in ELT which have been further challenged by AI: authorship, the prioritization of language structure over social context, and the idea that language learning is a value-free endeavor. She then discussed four new priorities for language education that can help us to rebalance what matters in language education in the age of AI: affect, imagination, ethics and futures-thinking. Pursuing my EdD in NIE was one of the best decisions I made.


There were three things in this experience which I am grateful for. The first was the coursework – despite the rigour, the learning from the various modules gave me the knowledge and confidence that I needed for my professional growth. The second was the support system from my peers. Everyone whom I had met was generous with sharing tips and strategies, and all genuinely wanted those in the course to succeed. The third and most important were my two amazing supervisors, Dr Willy Renandya and Dr Sally Ann Jones. Dr Willy and Dr Sally provided the perfect balance of mentorship yet encouraged my independence and curiosity as a researcher.

My research focused on using critical literacy and a critical visual literacy framework (synthesised from two theories) in the design of two self-assessment tools, proposed to be used as self-feedback to enhance students' speaker credibility in their presentation skills. Qualitative findings indicated the usefulness of one of these tools.


I must conclude with sharing two career milestones which took place during the course of my EdD – I was offered a full-time faculty role at Nanyang Business School (NTU) and am now team lead of my department. I continue to enjoy what I do at NBS but with even greater self-assuredness now, teaching business communication strategies to undergraduate and postgraduate students.
