



# **Master of Arts (Applied Psychology)**

This programme is designed to provide theoretical knowledge and research insights as well as practical skills to interested individuals who have the pre-requisite qualifications to train as specialists in the field of Educational Psychology or Counselling Psychology. It provides specialist training as an Educational Psychologist or a Counselling Psychologist. It also provides graduates with training towards becoming a Registered Psychologist in Singapore.



#### **Target Audience**

Associate Psychologists, counsellors/paracounsellors, social workers and educators who are motivated to acquire knowledge and skills in the field of psychological service.



## **Entry Requirement**

- · A good Bachelor's degree preferably with honors, from a reputable university.
- Preference will be given to those with a first degree in psychology, at least two years of relevant work experience and who are able to pursue the programme full time.

As the MAAP programme is highly competitive, only applicants who meet the minimum entry requirement will be considered for admission.
