Masters by Coursework

designed to meet the learning needs of educators and professionals working in other educational settings.

PhD and Masters by Research

designed for individuals who aspire to create cutting-edge knowledge, discover new things, develop new skills and seek greater depth of knowledge in a specific area.

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Doctor in Education

designed for professionals in education and education-related fields, who would like to extend their expertise and training and develop skills in research, evaluation and reflection on practice.

APPLYING TO OUR GRADUATE PROGRAMMES

• TOEFL / IELTS / GRE Requirements

International applicants whose first language is not English and graduates of universities with non-English medium of instruction are required to submit an official Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) or International English Language Testing System (IELTS) score. These tests dates must be no more than two years before the date of application.

Applicants pursuing research programmes, except for graduates of the Autonomous Universities* in Singapore, are required to submit a good Graduate Record Examination (GRE) score. The test must not be taken more than five years before the date of application.

In lieu of GRE, applicants from India may use the Graduate Aptitude Test in Engineering (GATE) score of at least 90%, the test must not be taken more than three years before the date of application.

GRE Minimum score of 319 for both Verbal and Quantitative sections. Minimum score of 3.5 for Analytical Writing section.

*Autonomous Universities refer to Nanyang Technological University (NTU), National University of Singapore (NUS), Singapore Management University (SMU), Singapore University of Social Sciences (SUSS), Singapore Institute of Technology (SIT) and Singapore University of Technology and Design (SUTD).

When to Apply

There are two intakes a year-in January and August.

Applicants are advised to check NIE's website and media pages regularly for the availability of the programmes at any particular intake.
