

Poster Presentation Submission Guidelines

The submission for oral presentation should observe the following word limits:

Title: 15 words

Abstract: 300 words*

*The maximum word count of 300 words does NOT include the title, author's name, and name of school.

What to Include

The abstract should include (but is not limited to) the following content:

- Brief mention of key literature and research gaps.
- Your research question(s) or reason(s) for the topic being addressed.
- Brief mention of key findings/discussions/arguments.

Poster Layout and Content

- Your poster must correspond to the title and content of the abstract you have submitted.
- Print your poster in A1 size (594 × 841 mm or 23.4 × 33.1 in).
- Plan your poster design and layout creatively to ensure a logical flow of information.
- Ensure your poster is legible from a reading distance of 1 to 2 metres.
- Keep your text to a minimum. Your emphasis should be on graphics, charts, tables, graphs, and photographs.
 - Avoid overcrowding figures and cramming too many numbers into tables. Legends and titles should accompany all figures, tables, photographs, etc., to allow their immediate identification.

Event Day Presentation Guide

- At the allocated time in the programme for Poster Presentation, you are to **stand by your poster and be ready to answer questions** from participants who visit your poster.
- Authors are responsible for mounting their posters before the session starts and removing them as soon as the session ends. Posters left up past that time will be discarded.
- Authors may wish to bring extra copies of their data and conclusions.
- Authors may also wish to provide sign-up sheets for attendees who may wish additional information, reprints, etc.

Additional Information

- The working language for NIE GSC 2024 is English.
- Presenters should be current postgraduate students. Faculty members are not allowed to present.
