NIE NTU SINGAPORE CELEBRATES THE CRYSTAL YEAR OF THE CARING TEACHER AWARDS

The National Institute of Education, Nanyang Technological University (NIE NTU), Singapore, in partnership with ExxonMobil Asia Pacific Pte Ltd is celebrating its 15th Caring Teacher Awards (CTA) 2024 Presentation Ceremony at the Dunman High School on Monday, 16 September 2024.

This year, the Caring Teacher Awards, themed 'Instilling a caring culture', saw a 14% increase in nominations and an 8% increase in participation from schools, bringing the total to 12,984 nominations from 259 schools. Supported by the Ministry of Education, the awards recognise outstanding educators who have demonstrated exceptional commitment to the holistic development of their students. After rigorous evaluation, an external panel of judges selected three National Level Award winners and seven National Commendation Award winners.

"As we celebrate the 15th anniversary of the Caring Teacher Awards, we are reminded of the pivotal role teachers play in shaping the future of our society. Their dedication and compassion inspire us all, and it is an honour to recognise their unwavering commitment to nurturing the next generation," said Professor Liu Woon Chia, NIE Director.

Guest-of-Honour **Ms Gan Siow Huang, Minister of State for Education and Manpower**, will present the awards to 10 teachers comprising four Primary, four Secondary and two Junior College/Centralised Institute educators at the Dunman High School. Out of the 10 teachers, three will be awarded the **National Level Award Winner**, and the rest will be recognised as **National Commendation Award** winners.

ABOUT CARING TEACHER AWARDS

Celebrating 28 years since its inception in 1996, the biennial award is aimed at acknowledging and rewarding local school teachers who through their daily deeds and actions, exemplify the values of caring, sharing and concern for the academic, moral, social, emotional and mental welfare of their students.

Schools are invited to submit up to five nominations for the School Level winners, and to select one for the National Level Award nomination. Of these, a preliminary round is conducted to shortlist outstanding candidates for the National Level Award. Thereafter, the shortlisted National Level Award nominees are invited to meet an external panel of judges who will select the **National Level Award** winners.

The remaining nominees are recognised as **National Commendation Award** winners. All nominees are highly regarded by the local school community as nurturers, inspiring individuals and mentors. Mdm Chitra Devi Gunasegar Sengkang Green Primary School

'Impactful Approach to Inclusive Education'

Chitra's teaching philosophy centers on creating a space where every student feels valued, supported, and understood, which she believes is crucial for their confident growth as learners. Her son's mild autism diagnosis led her to extensive research, enhancing her empathy and skills in supporting special needs students, enriching both her parenting and teaching approaches to create inclusive learning environments.

Her memorable teaching experiences highlight her ability to make a profound impact on her students' lives. One such instance involved an eleven-year-old girl with ADHD, whom Chitra helped manage her impulsivity through positive reinforcement and small tasks. This approach not only improved the student's behavior but also fostered a supportive classroom environment. Another notable experience was with a dyslexic student, for whom Chitra developed differentiated instruction materials to enhance learning outcomes.

Chitra believes that instilling a caring culture in the classroom positively impacts both students and the broader community. By promoting empathy and kindness, she creates an inclusive and supportive atmosphere where every student can thrive. Her commitment to supporting students' emotional well-being during difficult times further underscores her role as a compassionate educator.

Mdm Ng Peck Wee Raffles Girls' School (Secondary)

'From Corporate to Classroom: Mdm Ng Peck Wee's Journey of Impact and Care in Education'

Peck Wee made a significant mid-career change ten years ago, transitioning from a successful 20+ year tenure in corporate banking to teaching at 48. Driven by a desire to contribute to society, she embraced the challenges of adapting to a new profession, taking a significant pay cut to enrich the minds of the next generation.

Peck Wee continuously explores and implements innovative teaching strategies, believing that academic performance alone is insufficient in today's complex world. She advocates for holistic development through life lessons, moral values, and resilience. Her guiding principle, "If you have the right attitude, you can achieve anything," resonates deeply with her students.

Over the past decade, she has guided two graduating batches of girls from Year 1 to Year 4, witnessing their transformation into confident young women. One poignant memory from the last day of school in 2019, where heartfelt goodbyes underscored the close bonds fostered in her classroom, highlights her profound impact.

She advocates for a caring classroom environment, emphasizing empathy, kindness, and mutual respect. Her personal connection with students, meeting with each individually to understand their challenges, has led to meaningful interventions. She collaborates with

parents to support student well-being and organizes community service activities to teach empathy and kindness. Her influence extends beyond the classroom, inspiring students to excel academically and develop into compassionate individuals.

Ms Seah Sim Yee Yishun Innova Junior College

Sim Yee's journey as a Chemistry teacher began with a passion for the subject, leading her to a dedicated career in education. She recognizes that teaching extends beyond imparting knowledge, embracing the opportunity to nurture students holistically, supporting them both academically and emotionally.

She is committed to being approachable and available to her students, offering online consultations and personalized guidance to address academic queries and personal concerns. Her innovative use of technology creates an inclusive learning environment, adapting to students' evolving needs and empowering them to become independent, resilient learners.

Inspired by her experiences as a parent, Sim Yee values trust and mentorship, building meaningful connections through heartfelt conversations and gestures of support. She aims to create a nurturing environment where students feel valued and understood, fostering a sense of belonging and empathy.

A notable example of her dedication is her work with a hospitalised student who was determined to complete her A Levels. By leveraging technology and developing innovative solutions, Sim Yee ensured the student's inclusion in daily classroom activities and examinations. This experience underscored the practical aspects of inclusivity and the importance of a supportive learning environment.

Teaching, for Sim Yee is about connection and heart. Her genuine care and concern for her students create an educational atmosphere where they thrive holistically, becoming confident, independent, and resilient learners. This nurturing approach not only transforms students but also inspires her colleagues to continually strive for excellence.
